Early History





1966

Compton Cafeteria Riots take place in San Francisco - marking a turning point for LGBT rights

Transgender and non-binary people participate in the Stonewall uprising, in response to police brutality at the now-iconic New York gay bar

The UK Government issues a statement affirming that 'transexualism is not a mental illness'

The Gender Recognition Act came into effectgiving trans people full recognition of their /2005 gender (male or female), legally

Equality Act enacts protections for LGBT **2010** people from discrimination at work

Proposed reform of the GRA stops short of recommended amendments- against a backdrop of trans-exclusionary rhetoric. The Human Rights Council reports at least 34 known murders of trans people this year in the US alone



1930 Lili Elbe undergoes one of the first recorded gender reassignment surgeries in Denmark

1949 Harry Benjamin introduces hormone treatment amongst transgender people in San Francisco





Fighting for Equal Rights



1998 Transgender day of Remembrance introduced to commemorate the murder of members of the transgender community

1999 UK Sex Discrimination Act includes protection on the basis of gender reassignment- later upheld in European law (Goodwin v. United Kingdom)

2004 International Olympic Committee rules that trans people can compete in the Olympics with legal recognition- a topic that sadly remains contested
