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# Introduction & Summary



# Introduction

The OMD Insight team's unique tracking study, Radar, surveys between 250 - 500 Brits weekly to glean insight on the nation's outlook and consumer's decision-making. It has run for 115 weeks, surveyed over 32,000 people in total and given OMD UK access to a rich, trendable dataset of consumer behaviours.

With the COVID-19 pandemic impacting everybody in the UK, we are using Radar to measure the extent of this impact and track how it evolves over time.

This week's report focuses on these most recent results, collected from a nationally representative sample of 250 respondents in the UK between Friday 18<sup>th</sup> June to Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> June 2021.

## Summary: The delaying of 'freedom day' has hit comfort levels with returning to out of home activities and driven a loss in faith in the government

- 01** **There were minor dips in the mood of the nation this week**, with 1ppt fewer people feeling happy, optimistic, or satisfied with their life but anxiety levels have dropped by 5ppts in the last 7 days
  - 02** **The nation's financial outlook is considerably more positive than the same period 12 months ago**, feeling more optimistic and financially secure and less stretched, despite a recent decline in financial optimism
  - 03** **The delaying of 'freedom day' sparked renewed frustration at the perceived shortcomings of the governments approach to the pandemic**, with strong disdain for not closing the borders earlier in the pandemic amidst rising concern over the delta variant
  - 04** Following the commencement of Euros 2020, **there was a 9ppt increase in the percentage of people watching sport on TV**, though there have been **declines in the percentage of people venturing out to hospitality settings** – with a 7ppt decline for both restaurants and pubs/bars
  - 05** As we surpass the midway point of Pride Month, **the levels of concern over LGBTQ+ rights have seen a considerable increase of +10ppts**
  - 06** After the announcement of the delay of “freedom day” due to the rapid spreading of the Delta variant, **we see a decline in those currently comfortable doing different activities**, especially booking an overseas holiday (-8ppts), live events (-4ppts), theatre/art galleries (-8ppts) and going to the cinema (-6ppts)

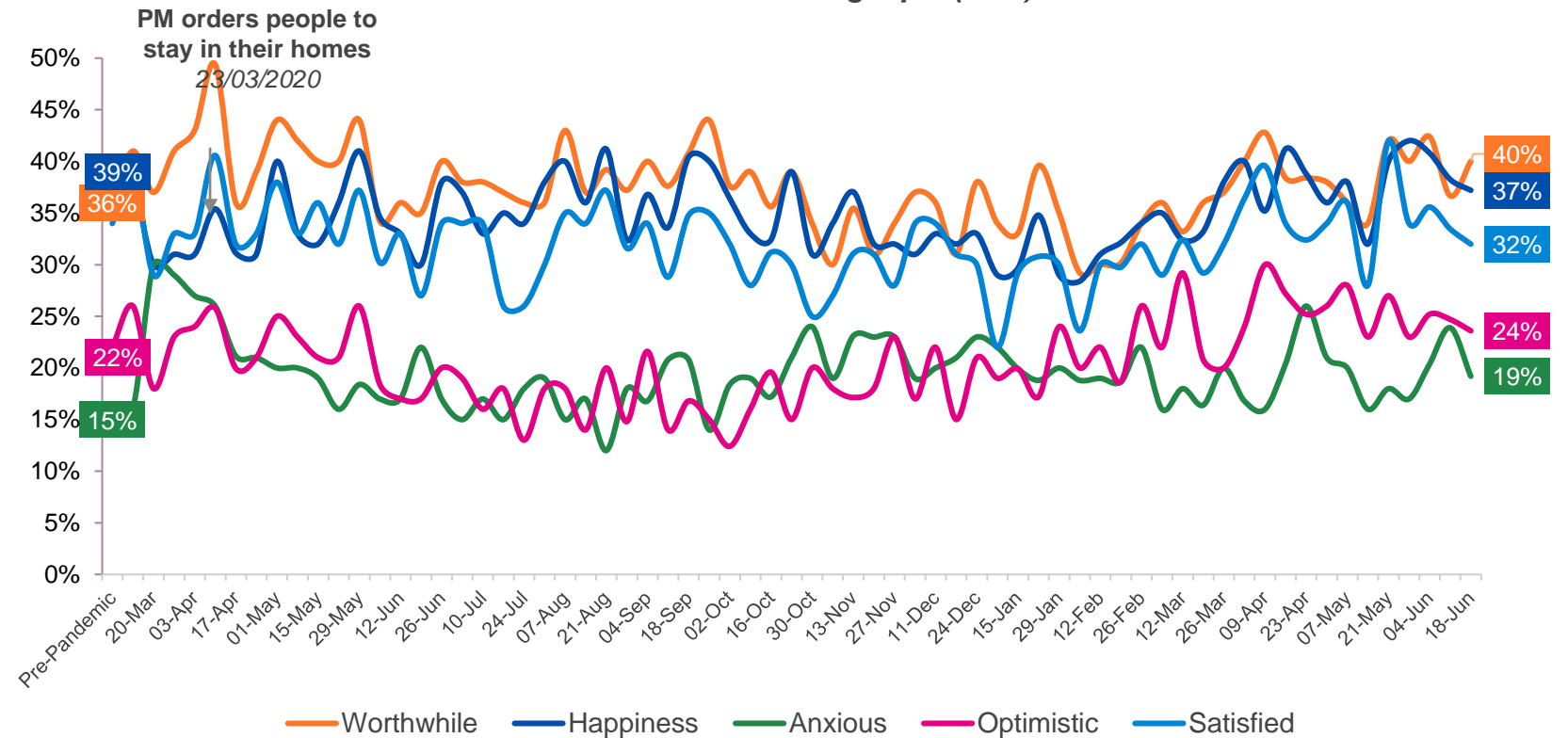

# There were minor dips in the mood of the nation this week, with 1ppt fewer people feeling happy, optimistic or satisfied with their life

% selecting top 3 (8-10)



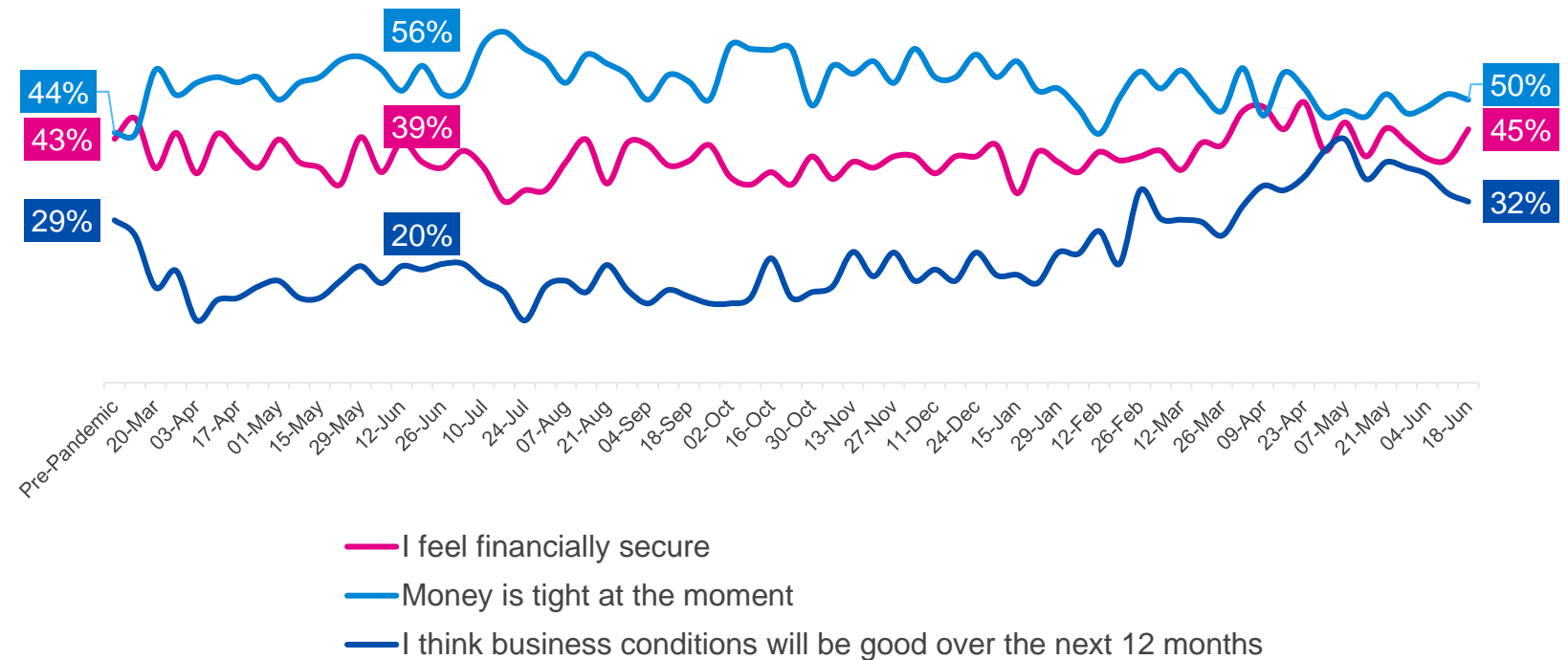
The percentage of people feeling financially secure increased by 6ppts this week, rising from 39% to 45% in the last 7 days



The percentage of people stating that money is tight at the moment declined by 1ppt this week



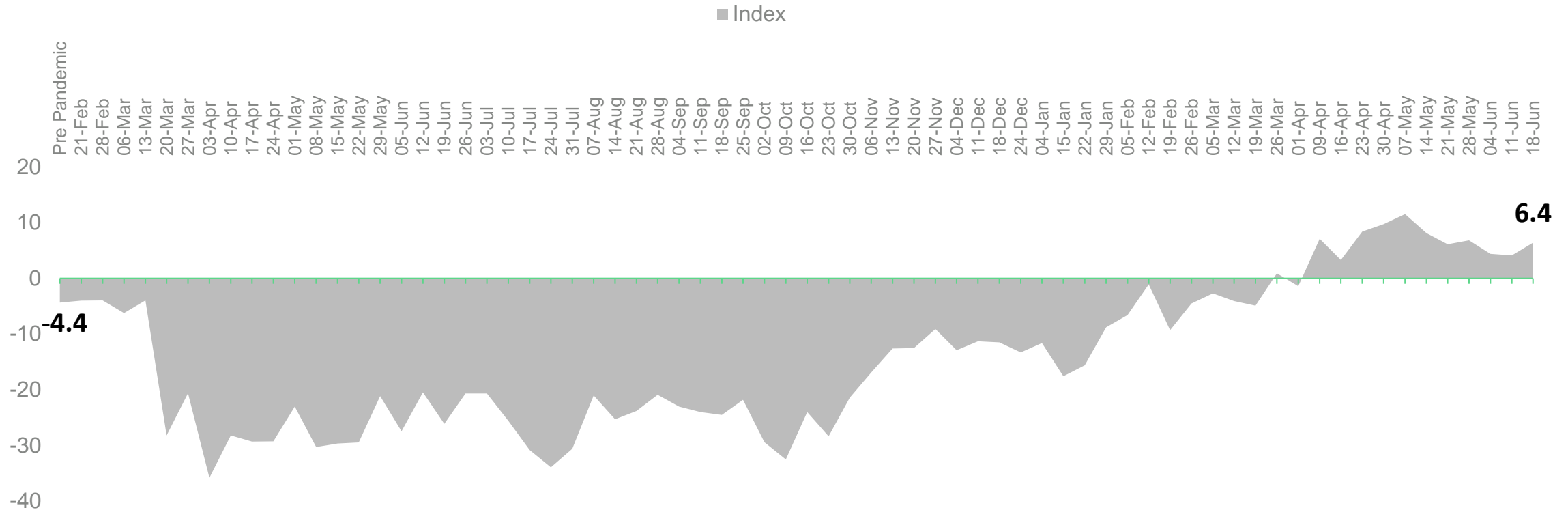
Confidence in future business conditions continued to decline, dropping by 1ppt from 33% to 32% this week – the 4<sup>th</sup> consecutive week of decline







# Consumer confidence has improved this week, increasing from 4.1 to 6.4 following declines across the previous 2 weeks



The Consumer Confidence index can range from 100 to -100 and is calculated by subtracting negative financial outlook from positive financial outlook. A zero score means equal positive and negative feedback. Please note that we have removed two statements that were originally included in Index calculations to get a more nuanced view, and therefore the data now shown in this chart is different to previous weeks.



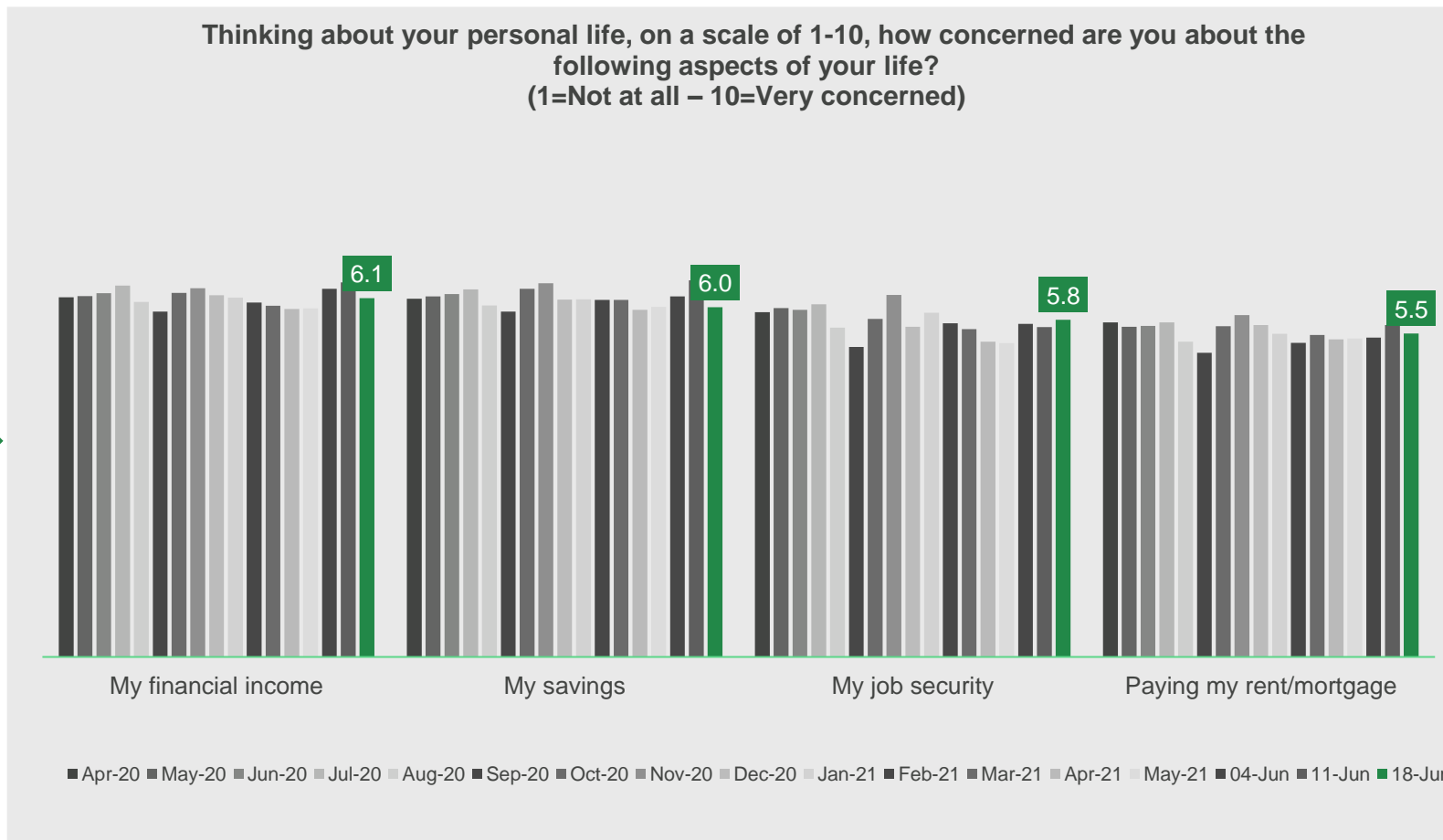
# Overall, there were lower levels of financial concern this week, though concern over job security increased

66% say that **their employer has been supportive** during the COVID-19 outbreak

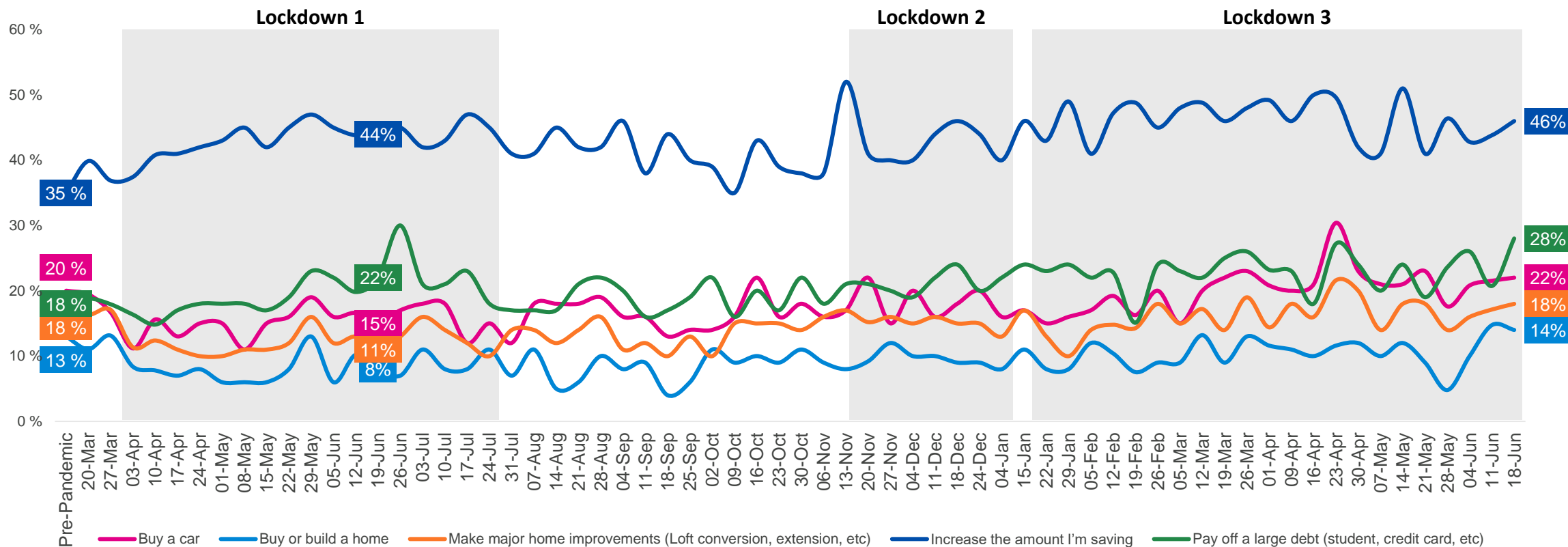




# Plans to buy or build a home dipped this week but expectations to make a significant financial commitment are considerably higher than 12 months ago

# The delaying of ‘freedom day’ sparked renewed frustration at the perceived shortcomings of the governments approach to the pandemic

The delaying of “freedom day” triggered discontent towards the governments whole response to the pandemic

*“They don’t really think of others and I don’t think it is fair for everyone to go through many lockdowns just because the prime minister thinks it’s okay to decide to come out of lockdown then go back into another one”*

The rise in the Delta variant, which has impacted ‘freedom day’, has reinvigorated frustrations surrounding border control and travel

*“All the lockdowns have been brought in too late even though the evidence could be seen in other parts of the world. The border controls have been extremely lax allowing new variants of COVID to enter the country.”*

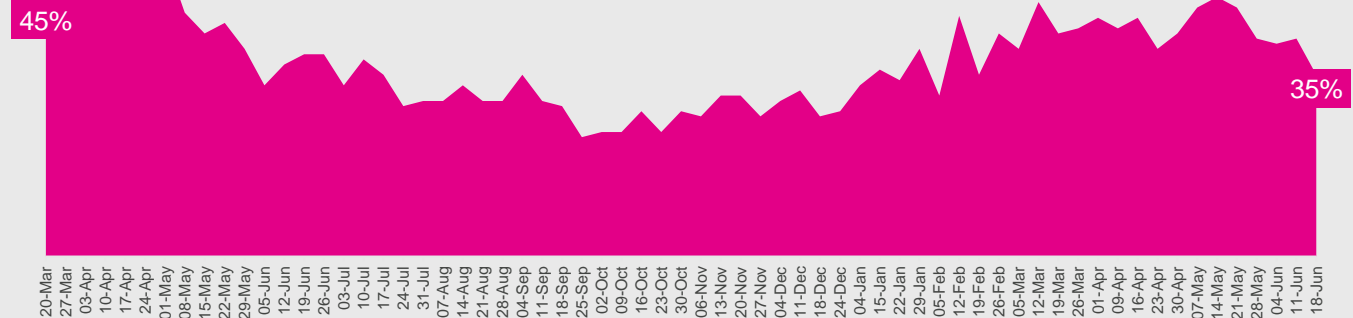
*“Because lock down should have meant lock down and not leave ports and air ports open only freight cargo should have been allowed in”*

There is strong disdain for the governments approach to supporting those in need and their own funding

*“The government does not care about the average working class person or family and would rather make cuts to public services and benefits to line their own greedy pockets”*

*“The government response has been both shambolic and corrupt, with the situation being torn between wilful mishandling to pacify party donors and gross exploitation of contracts for personal financial gain by government ministers.”*

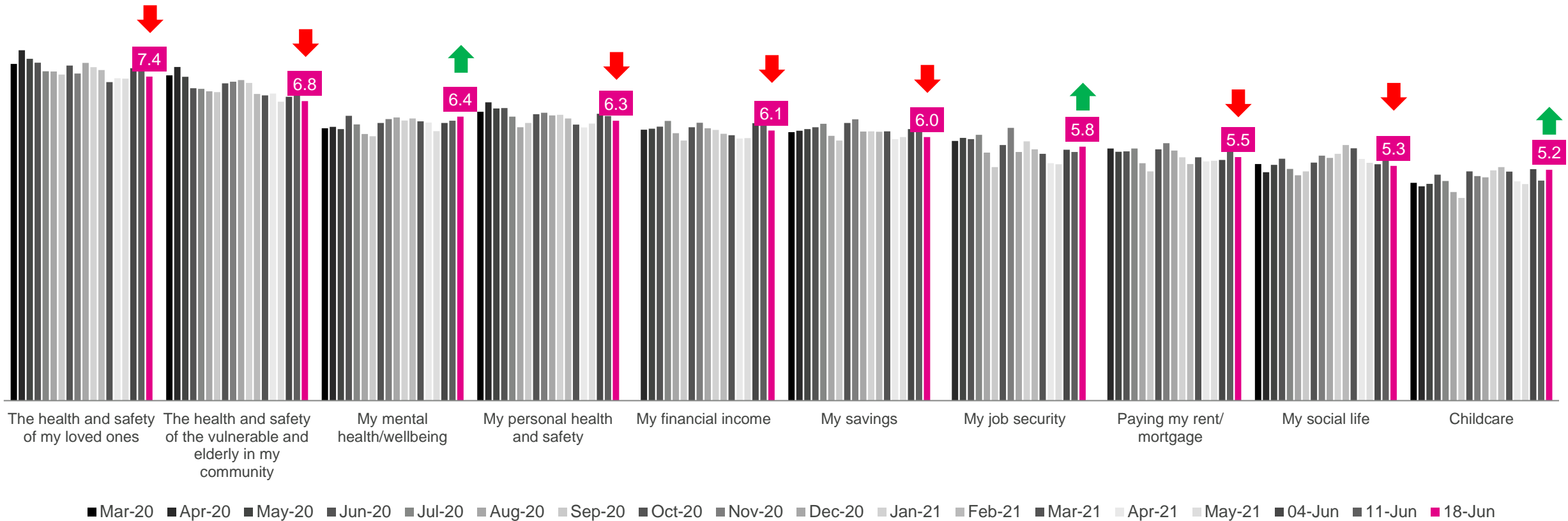
How confident are you in the government’s response to the COVID-19 outbreak?

(1=Not at all – 10=Very concerned)



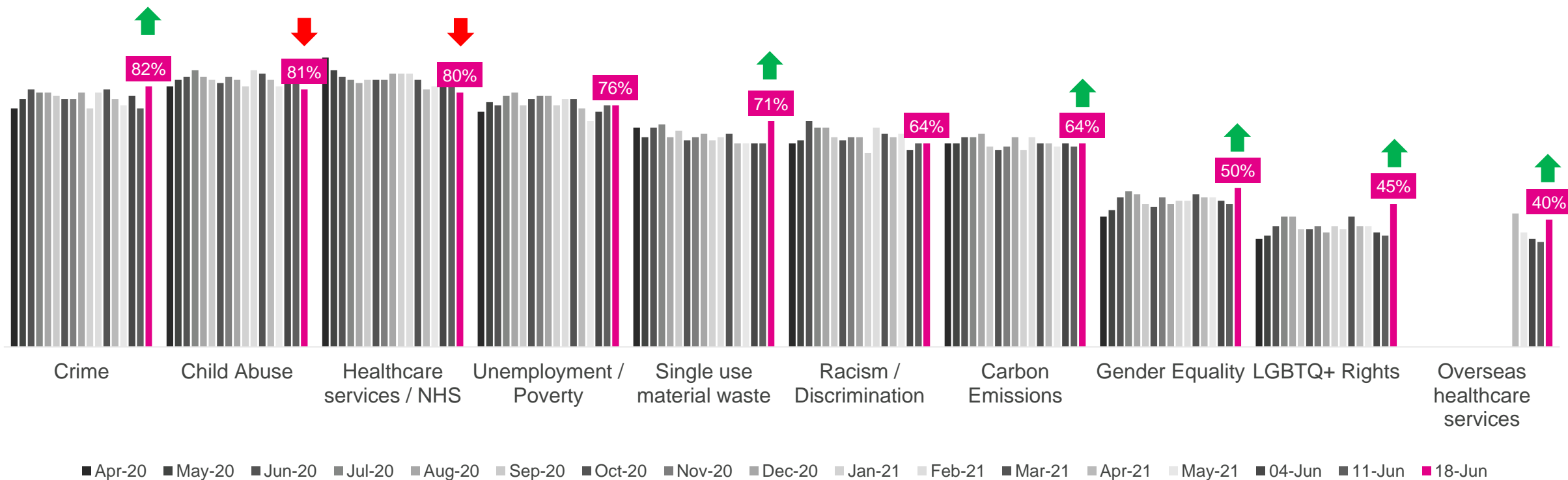

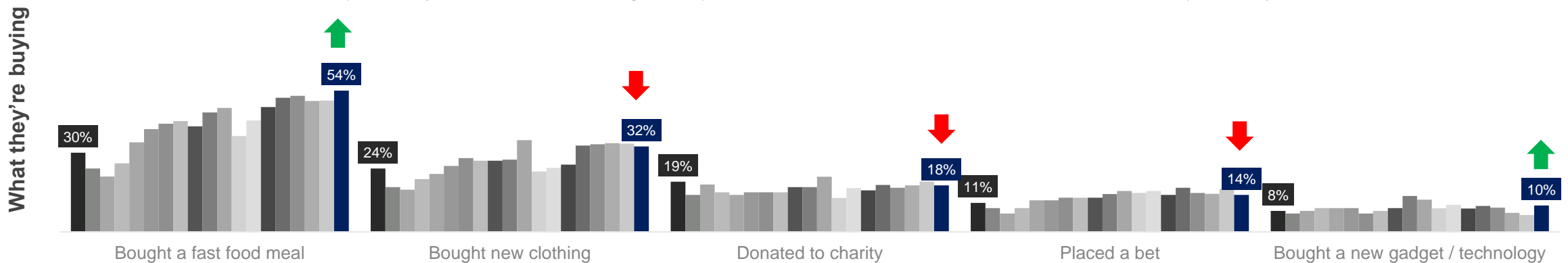
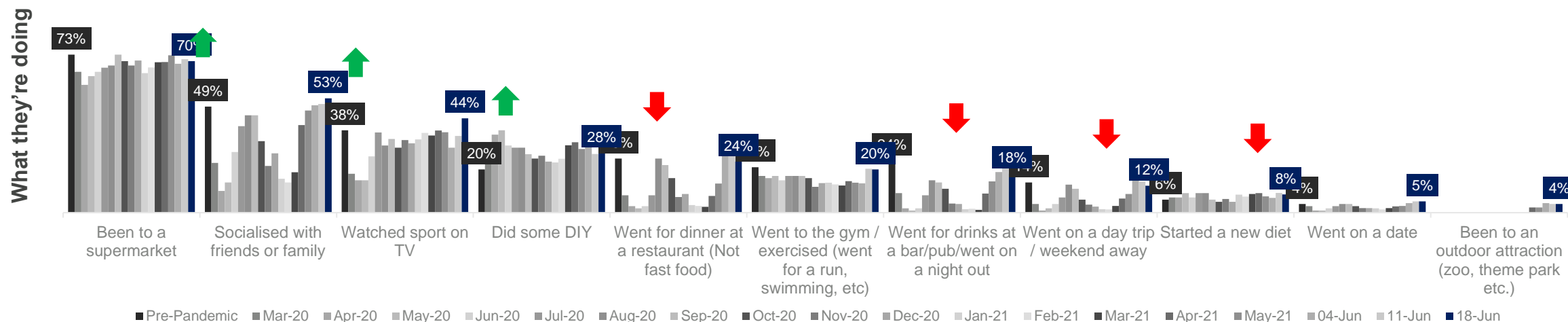




# Following the commencement of Euros 2020, there was a 9ppt increase in the percentage of people watching sport on TV

% who have done the following activities in the past 7 days



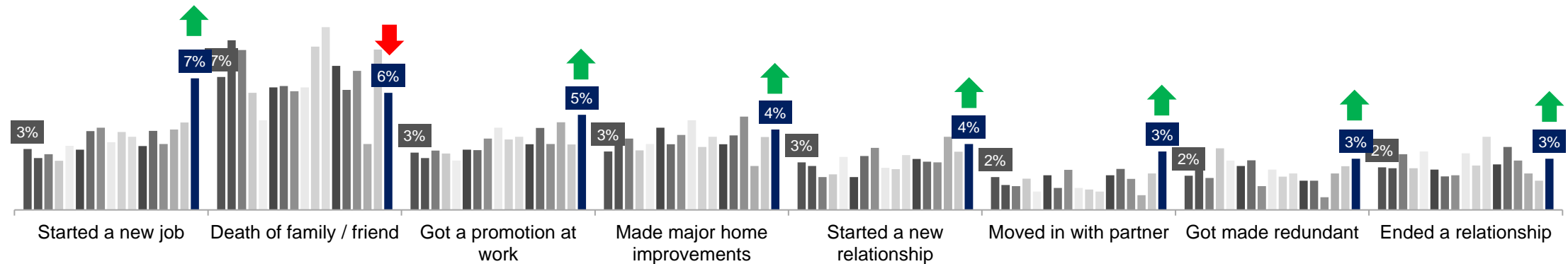

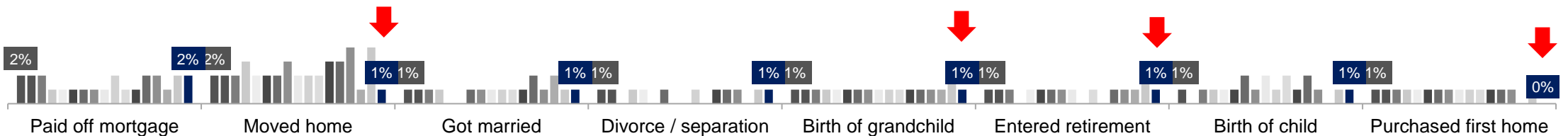
# Employment changes were high this week, with increased percentages of people starting new jobs, getting promoted or made redundant

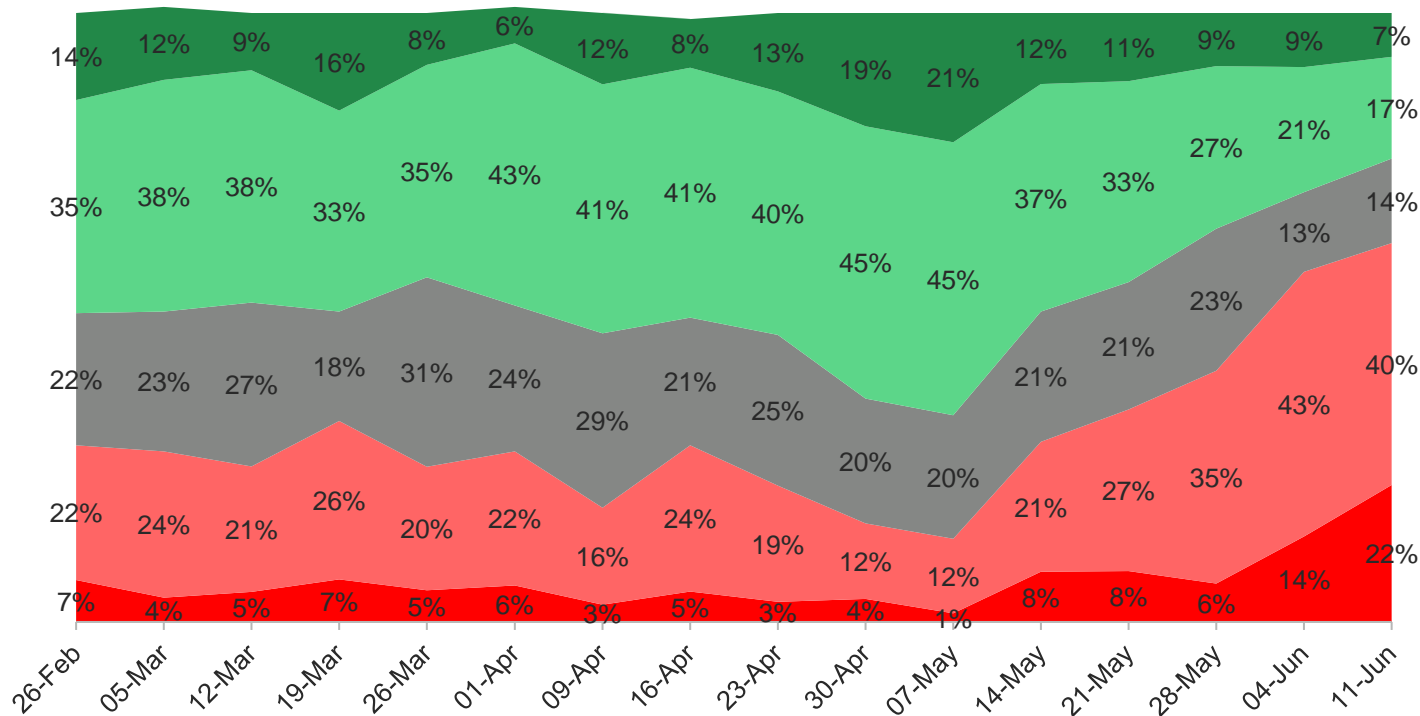

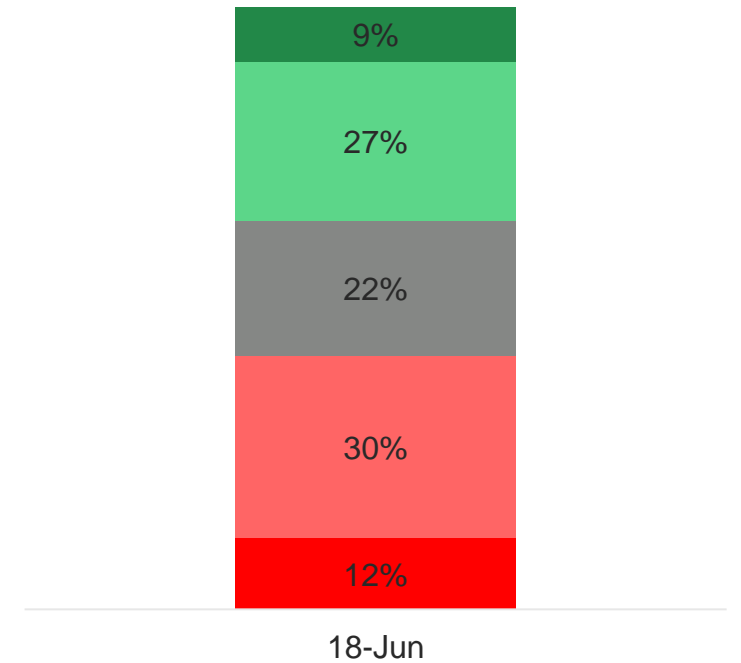

How likely do you think it is that all current national lockdown restrictions in England will be lifted on 19th July 2021?



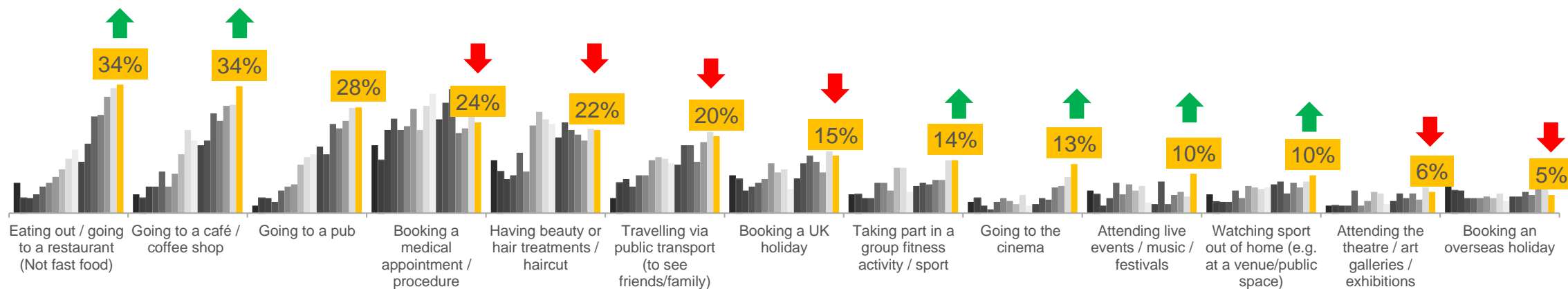

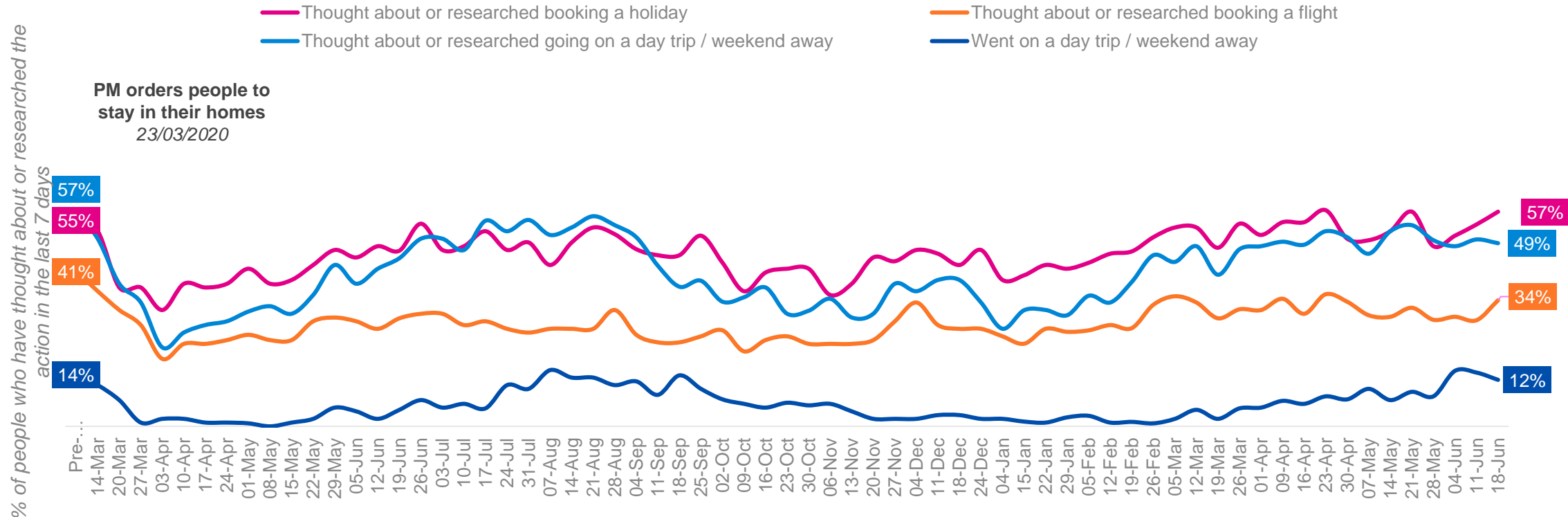

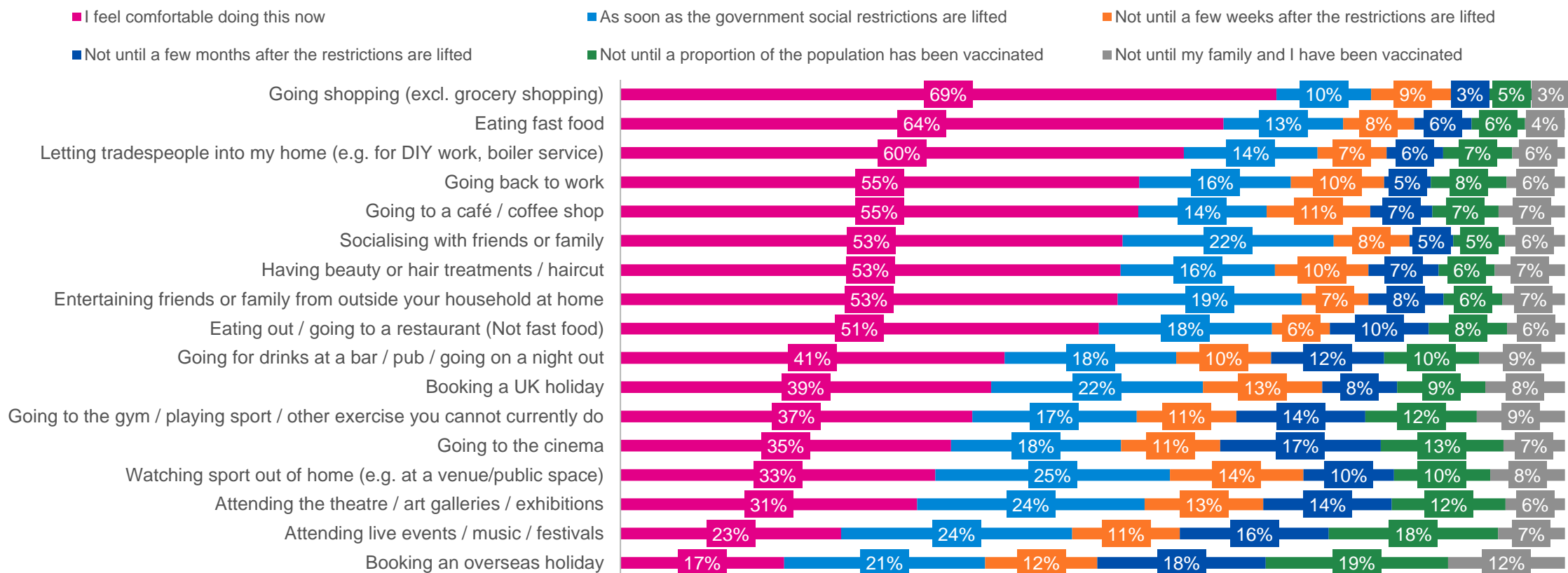

## When would you feel comfortable doing the following again?



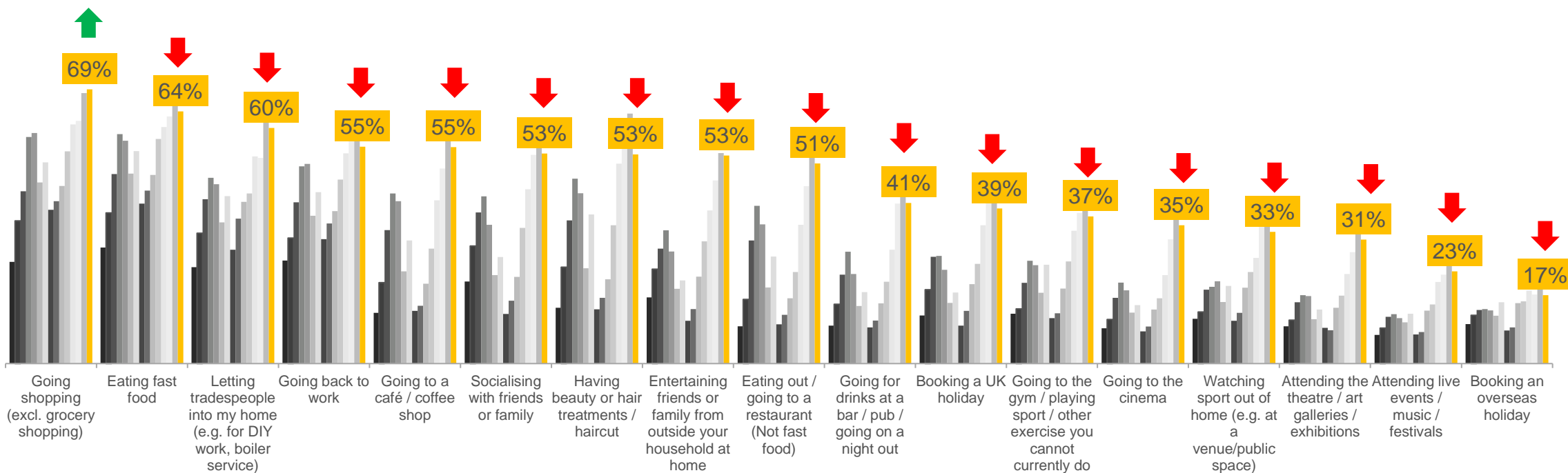

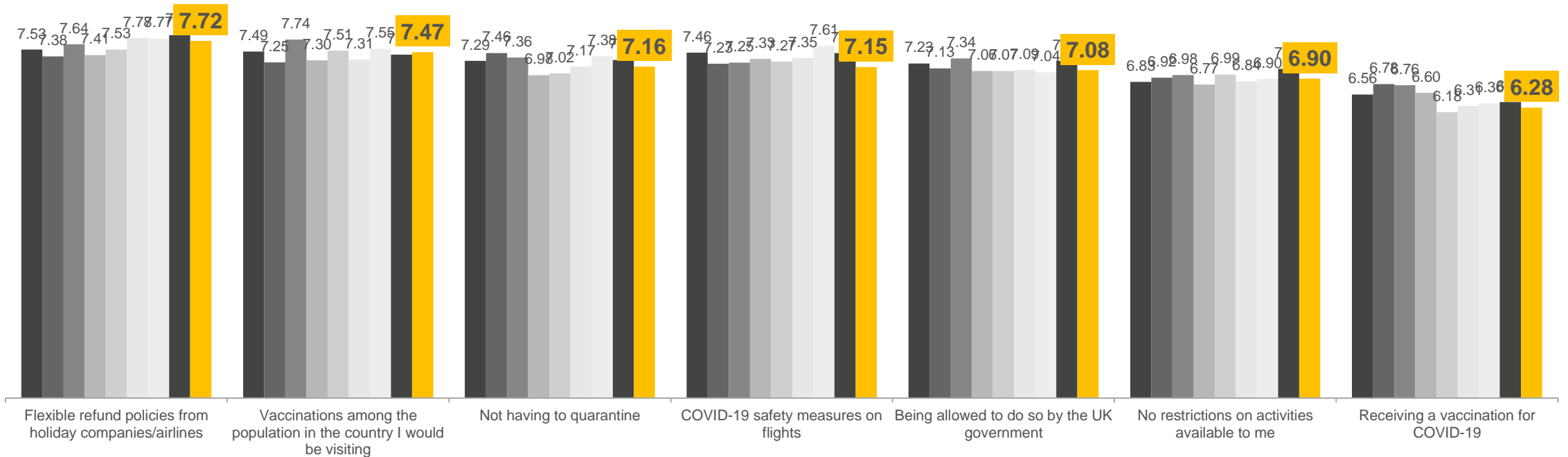


# Flexible refund policies remain the most important aspect to make travellers feel comfortable in booking an overseas holiday

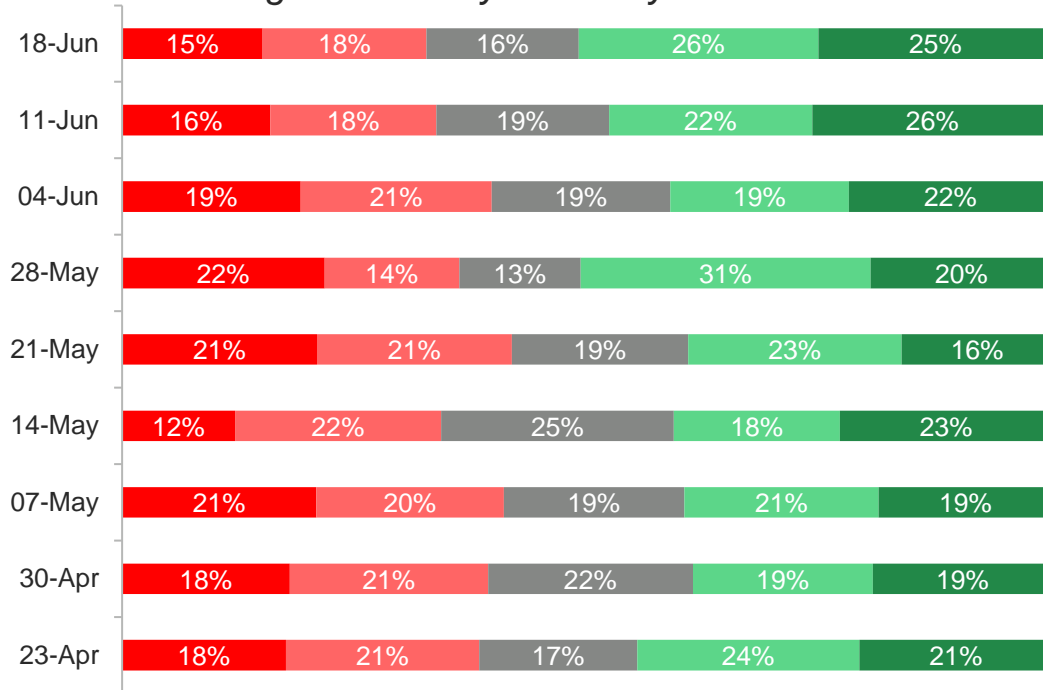

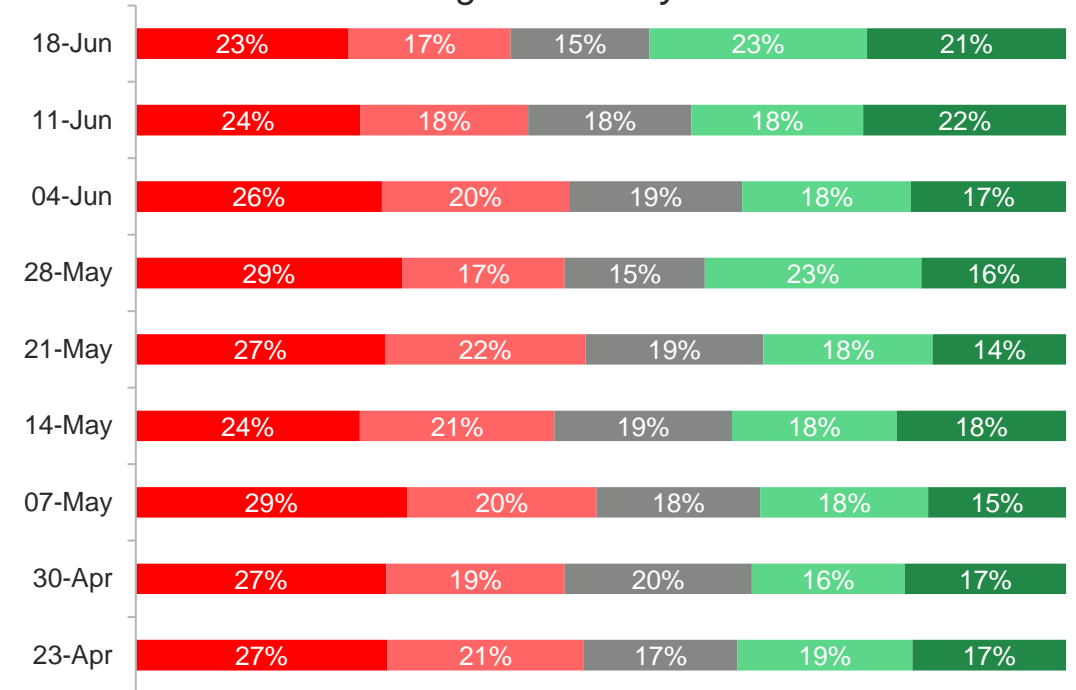
How comfortable would you feel taking a long haul flights (e.g. to Asia, Australia etc.) from 2022 onwards?

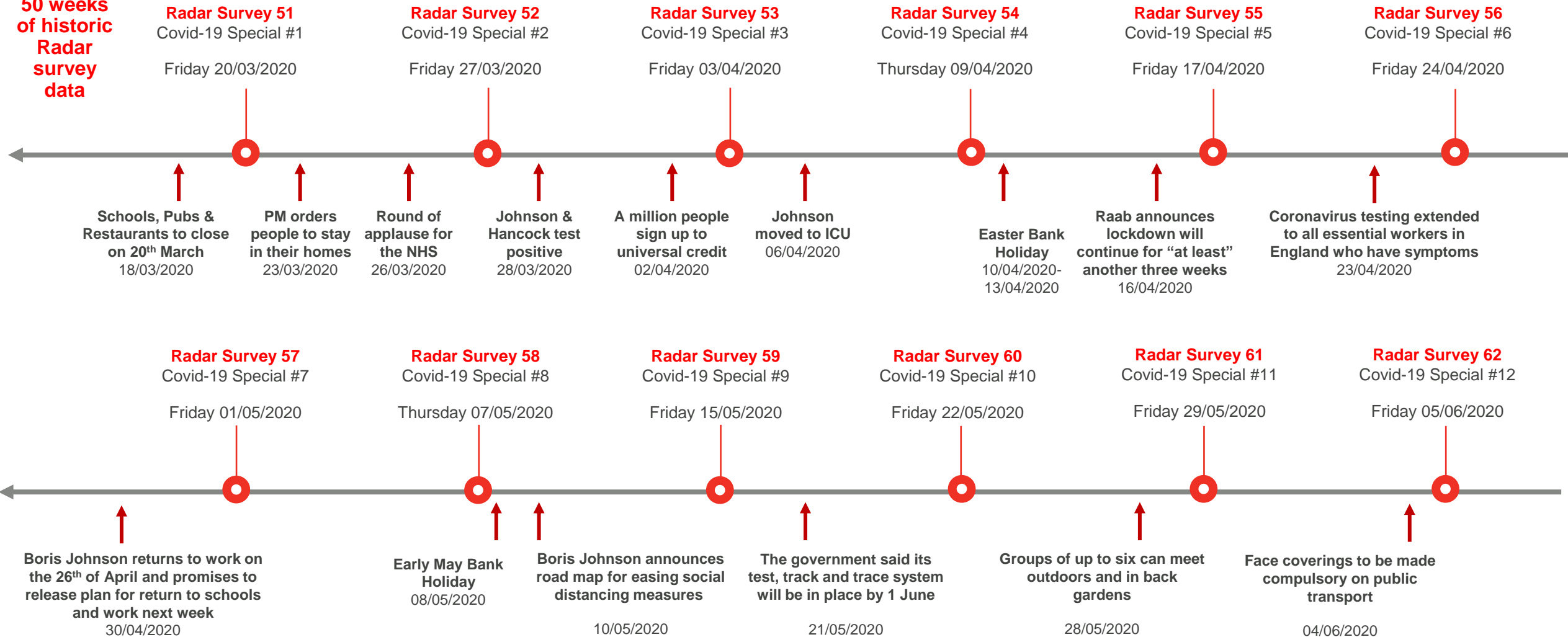
